



### Which children qualify for free school meals?

Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- \* Income Support
- \* Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- \* Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- \* The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- \* Child Tax Credit (as long as you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- \* Working Tax Credit run-on
- \* Universal Credit

In addition, schools must provide free school meals to all pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2. This is known as **universal infant free school meals**.

**If your child qualifies for free school meals, it's important that you tell the school** – even if they're in EYFS or KS1 and receive universal school meals for infant pupils, or are in KS2 and take a packed lunch – **as this enables the school to claim 'Pupil Premium' funding.**

### What do we spend the money on to support your child at Threemilestone School?

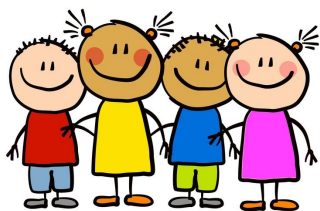

## What is Pupil Premium ?



**Pupil Premium** is a sum of money given to schools each year by the Government to improve the attainment of a specific group of children. This is based on research showing that children from low income families are more likely to perform less well at school than their peers.

## Primary schools are given 'Pupil Premium' funding for:

- Children in EYFS to Year 6 who are, or have ever been, entitled to free school meals based on their family income: £1320 per pupil, per school year
- Children in care: £2300 per pupil, per school year
- Children previously in care who have been adopted, or who have a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order: £2300 per pupil, per school year
- Children recorded as being from service families: £300 per pupil, per school year
