
#### Place Value, Addition and Subtraction!

This term, we will focus on Place Value, Addition and Subtraction. In doing so, the children will have a concrete understanding of the core basics including reading and writing numbers to 10 million, being able to identify the value of specific digits in any given number, becoming experts in rounding, ordering and comparing numbers using inequalities and looking at negative numbers across zero! We then go on to look at ADDITION and SUBTRACTION!

Alongside this, we will also look at boosting arithmetic skills. Mental maths or those quick fire recall skills, is a massive part of everyday maths in 6. We constantly look for those methods that help to save time, improve our understanding or hunt for the MOST EFFICIENT METHOD. Being able to answer arithmetic questions will help the children to improve their understanding and ability, whilst at the same time, improving their ability to reason and problem solve.

Over the course of the term, the children will use **Times Tables Rockstars** and **MyMaths**, both in school and at home, to help to enrich and deepen their learning. Both programmes are exciting, hugely rewarding and have a massively **positive impact on times tables** understanding. **Nrich** offer real-life problems and challenges that the children love to solve!







#### English:

Over the course of the Autumn term 1, children in year 6 will be writing a wide variety of exciting texts.

- During the first two weeks of the Autumn term, our writing will be linked to our science learning on
  evolution and inheritance. We will be writing a factual report on an animal species of our own creation
  and during this unit of learning, we will be focusing on using a range of complex punctuation, such as
  brackets, commas, dashes, semicolons and colons.
- After completing our factual report we will be diving into the wonderful world of narrative writing
  where we will be writing a 'Survival' themed story. Through our narrative, we will be aiming to create
  tension and pace by using the rule of 3, as well as ensuring we are using high-level vocabulary and
  continuing to incorporate a range of complex punctuation. These narrative will be exciting and
  entertaining!
- In the final two weeks of this half term, we will be producing a persuasive piece of writing, which will
  aim to persuade people to support the well-known charity, Shelterbox. During this two week writing
  unit, we will be focusing on using facts and statistics to back up our points, as well as using the
  imperative form of the verb, modal verbs and adverbs of certainty.

Phew - what a busy term!

#### Spelling:

This half term in year 6, we will be revisiting words from the year 5 /6 spelling list with a particular focus on challenge words. We will spend time looking at the meaning of these words and how they can be used within our writing in all subjects. Your child has a spelling list attached with the words we will be learning this half term, as well as an account for "Spelling Shed" which they can use to practise at home as frequently as possible.

#### Reading

It is important that you are hearing your child read regularly at home. Whenever possible, please question your children on what they are reading, ensuring they have really understood the text - you may want to ask questions on the meaning of key vocabulary, on what characters might be thinking or feeling and how you know, or about what might happen next in the story. Please encourage your child to read widely, testing out a variety of genres and topics which capture their interests.
