


Earth and Space

This term, we will focus on Place Value, Addition and Subtraction. In doing so, the children will have a concrete understanding of the core basics including reading and writing numbers to 1 million, being able to identify the value of specific digits in any given number, becoming experts in rounding, ordering and comparing numbers using inequalities and using ROMAN NUMERALS. We then go on to look at ADDITION and SUBTRACTION.

We will then move on to **ADDITION** and **SUBTRACTION** - building on **prior understanding** to further our knowledge of **formal** written **methods** and those **hugely important MENTAL** strategies.

Over the course of the term, the children will use **Times Tables Rockstars** and **MyMaths**, both in school and at home, to help to enrich and deepen their learning. English:

English in year 5 has been really exciting so far this year...so we thought we'd keep it that way!

We will spend most of this half term looking at a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, keeping a close link with our STAR learning. The children will recap on their knowledge of biography texts as they show off their learning about the novel Hidden Figures and the amazing women who made the American rocket launch possible!

We will then return to fiction writing to spend some time on Planet Unknown, where we will focus on modification of nouns to aid in description as we create our own strange and wonderful worlds based on our learning so far.

Spelling:

A separate list is on the website which contains your child's spelling list for the following half term. We ask that whenever possible you are continuing to revisit words from the year 5 and 6 spelling list as well as practising the words being sent home each week. Your child has an account for Spelling Shed which they can use to practise at home as frequently as possible.

Reading:

It is important that you are hearing your child read regularly at home Please encourage your child to read widely, testing out a variety of genres and topics which capture their interests. You may also want to make use of online libraries such as 'BorrowBox' and audible where your child can listen to audiobooks.
