
PAINTING: Secondary Colours

A secondary colour is a color made by mixing of two primary colours. The secondary colours are: orange, purple and green.



Paint colours can be lightened by mixing them with a lighter colour, such as yellow or white.

Paint colours can be darkened by mixing them a darker colour, such as blue or black.

3D FORM: Malleable Materials

Join means to connect a line, or place or things.

Malleable play helps children to develop their fine motor skills. It uses malleable materials, which are materials that you can easily manipulate.

If a material is malleable, it can be easily transformed with hands or tools.



You can join different materials with glue!

TEXTILES & COLLAGE: Weaving

The art of making cloth with yarn or thread is known as weaving. The pattern is made by pulling the threads together on a loom. The threads are locked at right angles to form the fabric.



Pattern is the arrangement of elements in some kind of sequence or repetition.


PRINTING: Impression Printing



Impression printing is when you apply pressure to an inked object/stamp and the image transfers onto another surface.

A good example of an impression print would be using a stamp to make prints.

You can make impressions with just about any material, even with your fingers!
