- Shops
- Medical care doctors, dentists, chemists
- Schools primary and secondary
- Transport links
- Parks and green spaces











Geographical Skills

- Investigate the physical and human features of the school and school grounds: naming and describing what they see (e.g.
 different areas including playground, car park, field, wildlife area) and how these areas are used; routes around the village,
 people's jobs, places that have been/could be improved, and so on (TMS and local area)
- Explore the local area of the school to investigate the range of buildings, roads, green spaces and other local features
- Visit some local facilities (e.g. shops, a library, a health centre) and talk about what happens there and investigate why people go there (TMS local area)
- Using small world play, model making, or the classroom role-play area to represent a visited place make a model of TMS local shops and amenities
- Drawing a freehand map (TMS area by shops, community centre etc)
- Making digital audio recordings when interviewing someone (e.g. shop worker, librarian, nurse) about their job (Doctors surgery, chemist, and members of community about what is missing)
- Using a questionnaire (to find out what other amenities people in the community would like eg parents, grandparents, members of the school community)
