The world is made up of countries
The countries are grouped into continents

The seven continents are
**Oceania, Europe, North America,
South America, Africa, Antarctica,
Asia**

Some of the continents are joined by land. Others are separated by oceans

The large amounts of water between each continent are called oceans.

The five oceans are **Atlantic, Arctic, Indian, Pacific and Southern.**



There are four main points of the compass: north, east, south and west. These are called compass points.



Physical features are natural features of countries that would be there even if humans weren't.



Human features are features that have been built by humans.



The **equator** is an imaginary line around the world which divides the **northern** and **southern** hemispheres.
