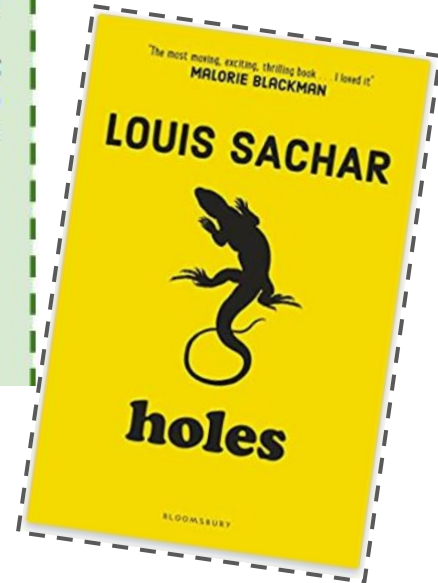

English:

Over the course of the Spring term 1, children in year 6 will be writing a wide variety of exciting texts. We will begin to collect evidence throughout the term for our end of year assessments, really showing off all that we are capable of!

- Our year will begin with some descriptive writing, where we will be writing a **setting description** of the famous 'Pink Mosque' (formally known as the Nasir al-Mulk Mosque). The children will be learning how to use patterning alongside a range of figurative language techniques, such as: personification, similes, hyperbole and metaphors. Here we will be **writing to entertain**.
- After completing our setting description, we will be diving into the wonderful world of **narrative (writing to entertain)**, inspired by our STAR learning theme this term of 'Into the Light'. Using a brilliant video named Dangle as our inspiration, we will work on building tension and pace in our writing using the rule of 3, as well as punctuating split speech carefully.
- Our final text of Spring Term 1, will lead us into **writing to discuss**. Linked to Safer Internet Day in early February, we will be writing our own discussion text on the pros and cons of the internet. In this text, we will be introducing the subjunctive form, as well as using complex punctuation such as colons, semicolons and dashes.

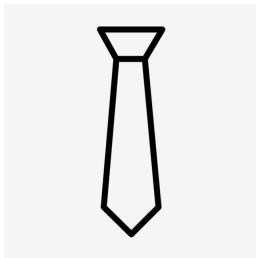
